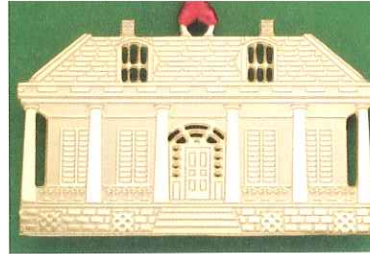


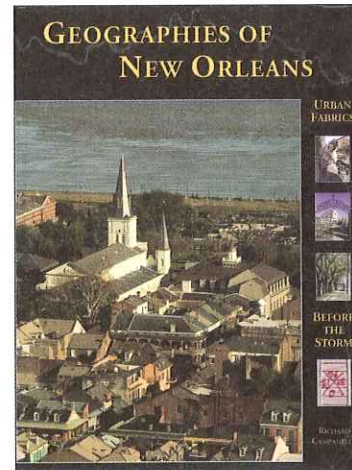
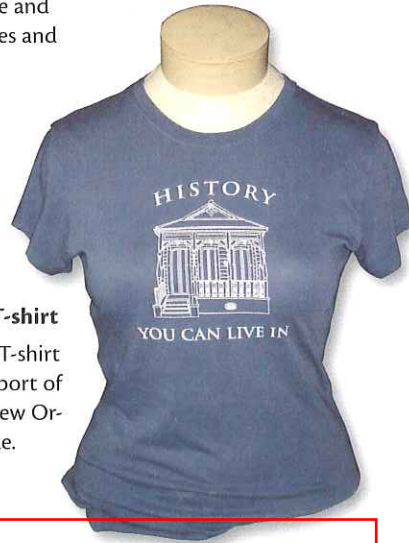
**"Jam Session, New Orleans-style"**

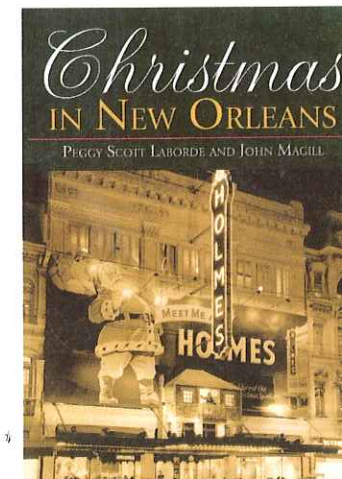
**Adornment 2009 by Mignon Faget**  
This ornament commemorates the Meilleur-Goldthwaite House, which was built in 1828 by Simon Meilleur. Also known as the Treme Villa, it was the site of the city's first brickyard. The mansion serves as the New Orleans African-American Museum's main exhibition space. Mignon Faget has been paying tribute to the PRC since 1996 by designing a series of wearable ornaments inspired by classic New Orleans architecture.

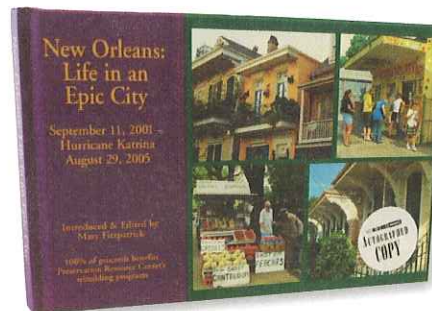


**"A skeleton key to my heart"**

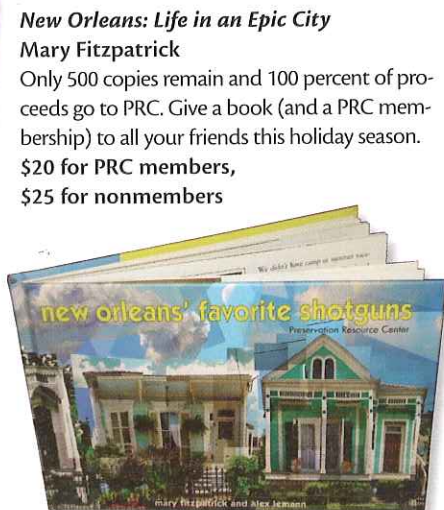


**Operation Comeback Property for Sale**  
4804 Dauphine St.

"The tree house" as it is fondly known is the great comeback kid. During Katrina, a 60-ton pecan tree fell on the house, splitting it in half. PRC staff renovated it to an even greater glory. The 1870s Greek Revival shotgun home has a single-family floor plan with more than 1,500-square feet. The ample corner lot (62' x 101') was carved from the old Jourdan Plantation in Holy Cross, where the Industrial Canal meets the Mississippi River. The renovation features top-of-the-line product innovations like ceramic ne-slate roof tile and a small duct, high velocity air-cooling system. Visitors have called it graceful and classy. Enjoy the beautiful view of the river, canal and downtown. The three-bedroom, two-bath property is being offered at \$199,000.
